

The Public Communication and Outreach Committee (PCOC) of the Water Environment Federation (WEF) is again, for the fourth time, sponsoring an exhibit as part of the Conservation Trail at the 2010 BSA Jamboree. The conservation area is always one of the highlights with participation in the past by about 25,000 Scouts and Scout leaders. In 2005, our exhibit educated more than 15,000 Scouts and Scouters on the importance of water quality - watershed, wastewater infrastructure needs and prevention of sewer overflows due to oil and grease clogs and Biosolids.

We are in the process of developing a list of potential volunteers. The WEF Jamboree exhibit requires about 20 volunteers each day to staff the exhibit. The exhibit will consist of five interactive stations where WEF volunteers will briefly explain the activity.

We are not asking for a commitment, just an express of interest. You do not need to be a registered BSA Leader to help staff the WEF exhibit. You will have the option of commuting locally for one or more days or even staying for the entire Jamboree, either at Fort A.P. Hill or at a local motel. More details will be provided once we have more information from BSA.

Volunteers who live within driving distance of the Jamboree may help to staff the exhibit for as many days as they wish. Due to the restrictions on how many vehicles passes we are allowed, we will meet at a local motel and car pool to the Jamboree site.

The WEF will also have motel rooms available for volunteers who want to stay for several days and live too far away to commute. The WEF will pay for the motel rooms for those staying off-site; however, meals will be each volunteer's responsibility.

If you wish to participate in the entire Jamboree experience and activities, then staying in Army tents (approximately 20 cots per tent), provided for the Jamboree on-site volunteer staff is the best option. The cost of staying on-site at the Jamboree is \$795. In the past some employers have agreed to pay all or part of this registration fee. Transportation to the Jamboree from home will be the responsibility of each volunteer.
