

## Nominations Open for Leroy Scott Award

Nominations for the annual Leroy H. Scott Award are currently being accepted by the Florida Water Environment Association. The award recognizes FWEA members, who are wastewater treatment plant operators, for making the greatest contribution to their fellow operators during the year, or for doing the best job of operating a plant, regardless of size or available equipment. If the award committee deems no one worthy of the award, none is presented.

The honor is named for Leroy H. Scott, who first came to Florida in 1941 as a captain in the R&U Branch of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. His extensive knowledge of all phases of water and wastewater operations, his willingness to help others and his practical approach to solving the many problems of those hectic times endeared him to everyone with whom he came in contact. Following a tour of duty in the Philippines and his discharge with the rank of lieutenant colonel, Scott returned to Florida as district engineer for an equipment manufacturer. His many friends were grieved by his premature death in 1949.

Resumes are being solicited by the Leroy H. Scott Committee through **February 1, 2008**. **Each applicant must have been a member of the FWEA for a minimum of two (2) years.**
