

Student Design Competition



The 2025 Student Design Competition (SDC) was held at the Florida Water Resources Conference (FWRC) and tasked students with designing and presenting solutions to real-world engineering problems. Teams from various universities traveled to West Palm Beach on May 4, 2025 to compete in either the Wastewater or Environmental categories, and presented on topics such as wastewater treatment facility improvements, stormwater management, and flood mitigation.

The competition aims to give students interested in pursuing a career in water/wastewater engineering and sciences real-world design experience. This year, six teams from five different universities and colleges across Florida participated and competed in one of two categories. First-place winners received a \$4,000 travel allowance to represent Florida at the national Water Environment Federation Technical and Exhibition Conference (WEFTEC) in Chicago, along with a \$1,000 Norm Casey Scholarship. All other teams received a \$500 participation bonus.

Congratulations to all the students who participated! Special recognition goes to the students from the University of South Florida (USF) for winning first place in both the wastewater and environmental categories. These teams will represent Florida at the national stage during WEFTEC in September!

We would like to express our gratitude to all of our SYPC sponsors and the panel of SDC judges for volunteering at this year's SDC. We look forward to seeing the research and design projects that students will bring to the 30th Annual SDC next year!

SDC - Winners' Experience

First Place Wastewater Team: The University of South Florida, also known as SustainaCore, had an unforgettable experience presenting at the conference. Their project, "From Waste to Worth: Biosolids Optimization at the Howard F. Curren Advanced Wastewater Treatment Plant," focused on enhancing the City of Tampa's current production of Class B biosolids by evaluating ten different treatment and disposal alternatives. After thorough analysis and design, the team recommended Solar-Thermal Pasteurization for its potential to significantly reduce biosolids mass while upgrading the end product to a Class AA fertilizer.

Beyond the competition, the team made the most of their time in West Palm Beach - enjoying the beach, exploring CityPlace and Worth Avenue, walking through the exhibition hall, and learning from industry professionals.

First Place Environmental Team: The University of South Florida, also known as ReNew Engineering Solutions, with team members Garrett Rolle, Chase Royall, Santosh A. Jagan, Nicholas Moran, and Regina Demechko. Successfully winning the environmental design competition was the perfect way to end the semester for USF's Environmental Team. The team is incredibly proud and excited to continue sharing their project on the David L. Tippin Water Treatment Facility Redesign and to continue learning through other presentations and seminars at FWRC.

YP Utility Workers Scholarship: Empowering New Industry Professionals



This year, the Summit took place on February 10 in Dallas, Texas. It serves as the premier workshop for young professionals in the water and wastewater industry across North America. Attendees benefit from professional development sessions, networking opportunities, and interactions with industry experts, catering specifically to early-career water professionals and students entering the field.

Each year the S&YPC administers the "Young Professional of the Year" award, recognizing outstanding service to FWEA. The FWEA YP of the Year is an outstanding young professional that shows leadership, initiative, technical knowledge and actively participates within FWEA. The winner will be announced and awarded at the FWEA Awards Luncheon. The winner also earns a paid trip to attend the annual AWWA/WEF YP Summit. Nominations are now closed for 2025 and will reopen in the Spring of 2026.

YPs are not allowed to nominate themselves but are encouraged to have their supervisors or colleagues submit a nomination form on their behalf. Members of the S&YP Committee are eligible.

WEF 2025 National Water Policy Fly-In



The nexus between policy, advocacy, and how we manage our water is not always as clear as a glass of drinking water.

Water professionals, policymakers, students, and the public must stay updated on scientific knowledge, along with the impact of our choices on the environment around us, as innovation, policies, and societal needs shift.


In April, I attended US Water Week in Washington, D.C. as a WEF Young Professional Scholarship recipient and senior Civil Engineering student at the University of South Florida. Alongside Kristiana Dragash and Zachary Loeb — seasoned industry professionals in water infrastructure and operations — we met with congressional offices to advocate for PFAS generator accountability, labeling of non-flushable wipes, low-income water assistance programs, and tax-exempt municipal bond funding. We also visited a few offices impromptu, excited to share our passion for water.

I stepped from the classroom to Capitol Hill, soaking in the drops and splashes of strategy and candor it takes to advocate for water. And yes, the cherry blossoms in D.C. were in full bloom too.


