As we come to the conclusion of our series, you have learned about how to create a successful career path for life, the essentials of networking, and finding your dream job. Now, let's say that you have followed these principles and 50 years have gone by. As you get ready to celebrate the Golden Anniversary of your career, let's take a moment to look back and discuss the key points that may have helped you hold on to that dream job for so many years. These are common attributes shared by engineers who have found long term success and satisfaction with their careers. I have come to call them "Retention in the Engineering Environment" in my various speaking engagements around the country.

They keys to being retained in your dream job come down to four basic points:

Point 1: Forming the "Drea m Team" -- In the last article, we discussed finding your dream job but once you do, it is important to figure out your dream team. Early on in your career you probably figured out your strengths and weaknesses as an employee. Everyone has them, but those who hunger for success will realize what their weaknesses are, and surround themselves with folks who have those traits as their strengths. Making sure that the team you are working with is comprised of individuals that compliment your weaknesses and that you work well with is an important factor throughout your career. For

example, if you find that you are very technical in nature but have a hard time communicating your thoughts to clients, it is essential that a strong people person that enjoys client interaction is on your team.



Just as important as balancing out your weaknesses is finding team members that you click with in terms of work styles. This will keep changing as new team members are hired over the years and / or get promoted into new groups. It is important to have these things defined and communicated within your group so when hiring you can find the right individuals from the start. Once the perfect compliment is found for work styles and skills, your team will be the well oiled machine that

clients come back to over and over, and you can enjoy the camaraderie through the golden years of your career. I have



seen many teams of individuals that have followed each other to new groups and organizations over the years, as once you find that sweet spot it is hard to work any other way.

<u>Point 2: Communication</u> -- It sounds quite simple but effective communication is the key to any successful relationship. You have probably heard this from many who have reached the 50 year mark in ANY relationship, but it is especially applicable in your career. Keeping your operating plan and the goals to your career clear to your boss will help you reach those goals quickly and with fewer bumps. Point 3: Lifelong Professional Organization Involvement --

have a sick family member at home that you may not be able to put in 110% but even in those times showing loyalty, trustworthiness, and responsibility can go a long way to smoothly reaching your Golden Anniversary.

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

Day with the Rays



Hillsborough County's Wastewater Utility Critical Valve Assessment Program

The program required a significant data collection effort of all valves 4-inches and larger throughout the County's existing master pump stations, forcemains, and treatment facilities. The brief presentation will include methods and tools used to increase the efficiency of data collection and lessons learned through this unique, pre-emptive approach to asset maintenance.

Mr. Rappaport has over 16 years of experience applying Geographic Information Systems (GIS) spatial analyses to environmental resource management, route alternative studies, watershed modeling, hydraulic analyses, water flow analyses, urban planning, and utilities mapping. He holds an MBA and Masters Degree in Marine Science from USF and a Geology degree from University of Toronto and served as the Deputy Project Manager during the assessment project.
