## **2022 WEFTEC Service Project**

This year's WEFTEC conference was a success! More than 22,000 water professionals from all over the world flew into New Orleans for this event. Every year before the conference's official opening, SYPC hosts the Annual Community Service Project. Throughout the the Community Service Project vear, Subcommittee manages the project through Fundraising, the Desian, Logistics, and Development efforts. The goal of the project is to help the local community with water-related issues and educate the public about the value of water. This year I was a logistics lead for the Service Project.


The 2022 Community Service Project, "March to a Greener St. Augustine," was held at St. Augustine High School in collaboration with Water Wise. St. Augustine High School is a college preparatory school for young men in grades 8-12 founded in 1951 by the Josephite priests and brothers.

Back in August, students of St. Augustine submitted designs to be considered for the project banners, signs, and t-shirts. The winning design was displayed during the WEF Community Service Project, used in promotional materials for the Service Project, and featured on the t-shirts given to the volunteers at the Service Project.



On Friday, October 7th, we were on-site to ensure we had everything ready and to talk to students about the bioretention facility we were about to install. On Saturday, October 8th, with the help of WEF volunteers, we installed a bioswale that holds up to 4,279 gallons of stormwater and helps with the flooding issues in this area. Local and adaptive plants that bloom in school colors (Gold and purple) were planted to improve stormwater filtration and retention. This bioswale will also serve as a stormwater educational component for the community.

It is exciting how one year of preparation and one day of on-site work resulted in a wonderful environmental and aesthetic addition to the local community. The 2023 Community Service project will be held in Chicago, the Saturday before the WEFTEC official opening. 
# Florida Gulf Coast University at WEFTEC 2022

# **University of South Florida at WEFTEC 2022**



The Student Design Competition (SDC) for both the Florida Water Environment Association and Water Environment Federation was an exciting opportunity to exemplify the knowledge and skills learned in University and solve real-world issues within our region. Water professionals reflect the communities that we serve, and the SDC helps support the next generation of diverse and talented young professionals. Our solution was to design a treatment wetland system to provide enhanced nutrient removal of wastewater from a local municipal treatment plant experiencing rapid population growth. This process required an extensive amount of research, client interaction, and knowledge from experts within the field, which would not be made possible without the technical support and quidance of our professors and mentors. In the end, our client was pleased with our results, which led us to win in Daytona at FWRC and place third at WEFTEC in New Orleans!

Reflecting on WEFTEC in particular, we explored all aspects of the conference as students and young professionals in the industry and were eager to absorb all the information presented. This exposure to the water industry has been an eye-opening experience to the current and future trends in water quality from around the world through new technologies, education, and training. Professionals and students in water and wastewater engineering and sciences spoke about projects within their communities, sharing their approaches and design alternatives based on community needs and environmental context whether it be in Florida, Mexico, or Africa. 
#### Student and Young Professional Poster Competition


