









FWEA S&YP FY24-25 Organizational Charts

S&YP FWRC Committee Meeting





Student Design Competition





YP Summit



The Young Professionals (YP) Summit activities were held in Portland, OR, from February 11th-13th. Every YP should strive to attend at least once in the early stages of their career. It was an engaging and enlightening experience. There were many discussions and activities that provided insight on how to be successful in our industry and the copious amounts of support we have to help us be successful. The YP Summit was prefaced with a field trip to the Joint Water Commission Treatment Facility in Forest Grove, OR and the Fernhill Natural Treatment System (NTS). The YP Leader Training Day was held a day prior and was split between the two professional organizations: Water Environment Federation (WEF) and America Water Works Association (AWWA).

Beginning with field trips to the Treatment Facility and NTS, YPs were able to visit the facility that utilized conventional media filtration with coagulation, flocculation, and sedimentation processes prior to filtration. The NTS helped show us how wetlands are used to improve the water quality of conventionally treated wastewater by removing nutrients, cooling, and naturalizing the water prior to its discharge to the river. The field trips allowed YPs to network as well as provide information to how different areas of the country treat their potable water and wastewater.

The YP Leader Training Day provided valuable advice from a vast number of leaders in the water industry, providing guidance for the YPs to become the next leaders. I found the most influential part was all YPs should strive to be influencers when shaping our DEI future by breaking out of molds we sometimes find ourselves in and influence others to also break out of the molds to grow cohesively. Another important topic was discussing how we can engage more operators in YP events. We discussed initiatives in focused on operators for the event, such as having them perform demonstrations like the Ops Challenge that takes place at the state level and WEFTEC.





Events spotlighting operators are more likely to bring younger operators to attend and engage them. It was no surprise that this issue is consistently seen across our industry.

Finally, the highlight of the week, the YP Summit, was a day jam-packed full of speakers, breakout sessions, and an activity-filled lunch hour. The theme for the Summit was "Taking Care of Business" which was focused on cross-country collaboration, workforce development, and utility management. Discussions touched on getting to know co-workers by taking workplace personality assessments like the DiSC assessment to provide insight to peers and self for collective growth. Additionally, speakers emphasized that inequality amongst gender and race still exist and discussed ways in which attention can be brought to how to eliminate the inequities. Finally, the lunch activity was the water circuit challenge which engaged all participants to be educated in the ways that WEF, AWWA, artificial intelligence, and operators contribute to the industry. There were four operator challenges including the maintenance of a submersible pump.

Overall, the YP Summit proved to be a very education and insightful experience in which all YPs should make the effort to attend at least once in their career. The event and the people collectively left me with a refined set of goals and purpose as I continue in my career.

WEF 2024 National Water Policy Fly-in

This travel scholarship was awarded to 11 YPs across the country, including from Florida, myself, and Olga Mikhalchishina. Together with Kristiana Dragash we made the FWEA Delegation. The first day Olga had organized a tour of the capital building for the YP group, where we were able to see all the amazing art, engineering and history making up Capitol Hill as well as network and make new friends. I was able to make it to the Lincoln Memorial, Washington Monument, Supreme Court Building, and the White House, where I even ended up being stuck for a time at a security checkpoint when the Japanese delegation arrived to meet with the president.





Day two was the event presentation day, we met with the Government Affairs Community and went over upcoming legislation. Later that day we had many speakers ranging from Political Lobbyists and Senators to Utility Chief Officers. I learned so much and took advantage of the event to thank all the people who came to share all the hard work they do to help our water environment across the nation. Day three we were joined by our own WEF press mastermind Heidi Brag and met with our legislative representatives in their office buildings, which was a surreal experience. Here are essentially celebrities from across the country, making the decisions that impact the fate of the world, and we got to sit down and talk water with them.

I highly recommend wandering around the office buildings after a meeting just to see who you might run into, share your water story, and get a great selfie. I cannot stress enough what an amazing experience the Policy Fly-In was and how blessed I am to share my story with you. A huge thank you to everyone that supports this event every year and a massive thank you to WEF for investing in its YPs through this experience.

WEF YP Springboard Program




